#### A word from our Minister...

Last November, an old friend who is a Scottish theology professor teaching in the U.S.A., popped in to see me for lunch on a brief trip back home. As is his wont, he brought with him a gift. A book. One that had not long been published by a retired American Presbyterian Minister (H. Dana Fearon III) who served for forty-two years in a Church in New Jersey .The book is entitled, "Straining At The Oars" and is a series of reflections on life and ministry. I have been reading this book very slowly because although the chapters are short they are full of rich wisdom borne of a lifetime of faithful ministry.

Recently, your representatives have been continuing to work with Colston Wellpark and our existing Parish Grouping partners to prepare a new vision and basis for our proposed enlarged Parish Grouping. That has compelled us to look again at the nature and purpose of what we do as a Church. Towards the end of my new book, Dana, writes, "Thoughtful discipleship calls for faithfulness to the mission of Christ's church combined with the knowledge of the world into which the Spirit sends us. Discipleship calls for planning, knowing who we are, where we are, what the Spirit calls us to and be, and what gifts have been given to us for our ministry." (p.110) That seemed to me a good description of the task before us as we too "strain at the oars." As I write this article in the season of Lent, which you will read as we move into Holy Week and Easter, I am reminded that in the ups and downs of life, in the quest to be faithful, it is shared sadness as much as the shared joys that bind men and women together. Lent is a time to take time to let the power of our faith story take hold of us. Lent is a time to allow a fresh new taste of God! Jesus knew what it was to 'strain at the oars' to be faithful to His Father's will. His example encourages us to do the same.

#### Treasurer's Report

By the time this article goes to press the first quarter of 2014 will be nearly over!

Income and Expenditure for the period January –March is tracking the budgeted figures for the year and we have started to receive settlement of our outstanding Income Tax Claims from HMRC. The next claims that are due to be credited to us are the General Fund claim for Quarter 3 (2013) of £4,414 and £3,406 in respect of the Fabric Appeal 2012/3 and other misc. Fabric Items.

The main items of expenditure in March were our Central payment to the Church of Scotland of £7,254, part payment of our Glasgow Presbytery dues of £1,368 and a Loan repayment of £6,000 to the Church of Scotland General Trustees in respect of the Building work loan taken out in 2011.

#### Brother Lawrence

... and in conclusion to this month's church magazine – an interesting reflection.

At a recent Prayer for All session, the person leading for that evening indicated they were working through a Lenten sequence of reflections and had come across a piece from a monk unknown to him – or any of the rest of us there gathered. Not so our minister –

whose eyes lit up at the mention of Brother Lawrence and he was able to enlighten us to a degree about this remarkable Christian.

"It is enough for me to pick up but a straw from the ground for the love of God."

More than any other of his day, Brother Lawrence understood the holiness available within the common business of life. He began life as Nicholas Herman, born to peasant parents in Lorraine, France in 1614. As a young man, his poverty forced him into joining the army, and thus he was guaranteed meals and a small stipend. During this period, Herman had an experience that set him on a unique spiritual journey; it wasn't, characteristically, a supernatural vision, but a supernatural clarity into a common sight. In the deep of winter, Herman looked at a barren tree, stripped of leaves and fruit, waiting silently and patiently for the sure hope of summer abundance. Gazing at the tree, Herman grasped for the first time the extravagance of God's grace and the unfailing sovereignty of divine providence. Later, he entered the Discalced Carmelite monastery in Paris as Brother Lawrence. He was assigned to the monastery kitchen where, amidst the tedious chores of cooking and cleaning at the constant bidding of his superiors, he developed his rule of spirituality and work. In his Maxims, Lawrence writes, "Men invent means and methods of coming at God's love, they learn rules and set up devices to remind them of that love, and it seems like a world of trouble to bring oneself into the consciousness of God's presence. Yet it might be so simple. Is it not quicker and easier just to do our common business wholly for the love of him?" We can do little things for God: I turn the cake that is frying on the pan for love of him, and that done, if there is nothing else to call me, I prostrate myself in worship before him, who has given me grace to work; afterwards I rise happier than a king. It is enough for me to pick up but a straw from the ground for the love of God."

A copy of his book has been ordered and will be placed in the church library, in due course
