

A word from our Minister...

During the summer months I passed a significant milestone space in terms of my age. My children have been teasing me that I am now officially 'old', because I am ?0 years old. Reflecting on this, and on the adage, "you can't teach old dog new tricks", I have been trying my best to rebuff such suggestions. Evidence of my prowess with one of my recent birthday gifts, a Kindle, is surely a sign that I'm not really that old. After all I successfully downloaded a free copy of the Bible onto my new tablet.

I was heartened then to read that the brains of older people only appear to be less speedy, because they have so much information to access, much like a full-up hard drive, scientists believe. Elderly people have so much information in their brain that it takes longer for them to access it, scientific studies show. Older people do not decline mentally with age. It just takes them longer to recall facts, because they have more information in their brains, the research suggests. Much like a computer takes longer as the hard drive gets full up, so to do humans take longer to access information, it has been reported. Researchers say this slowing down it is not the same as cognitive decline. The human brain appears to work slower in old age, said Dr Michael Ramscar, but only because so much information has been stored over time. Older people simply know more, so selecting a correct choice from the trove of stored data may take a bit longer.

So my current mission is to keep sharing what I do know about the Christian faith by slowly dragging it out of my memory bank and passing it on. But I still might need to find my glasses first to read my tablet!

Treasurer's Report

I trust that you have all had an enjoyable summer break and trust that your batteries have been suitably re-charged! Since this is the first magazine of the new "session" I would just like to update you on all things financial that have been going on over the summer months.

Firstly, I would like to thank you to all the "regular givers" for their offerings over the summer months which has enabled us to meet all our outgoings over the period. Major items of expenditure over the summer months have included the renewal of the church and manse insurance at a cost of £3,534, another one third of our Presbytery dues for 2014 of £1,368 and we also continue to pay our Ministries and Mission Allocation monthly settlement of £7,554.30 with £17,662.90 still due to The Church of Scotland for this year. I am pleased to advise though that Glasgow Presbytery have reduced our total allocation for 2014 by £5,000 having taken into consideration our present financial situation with regard to the outstanding loan that we have with the General Trustees to fund the building work that was undertaken in 2011. Therefore the total payable for 2014 is now £70,543.

As you see from the figures below we are running at a substantial deficit on the General Fund for the year-to-date of £16,452. Although a deficit situation is not unusual at this time of the year it has been magnified by more delays at HMRC in settling our Tax Recovery claims on Gift Aid Offerings. Indeed, we still await final settlement of our Q4 2013 General Fund Tax Claim along with the Quarter 1 2014 & Quarter 2 2014 General Fund Tax claims as well as the Tax relief on the last Fabric appeal at the end of 2013. In addition another £1,250 is due from HMRC in respect of the Gift Aid Small Claims Scheme for tax year 2014/5. I am confident that with your continuing financial support and improved cash flow from the outstanding tax recoveries that this deficit will reduce substantially over the next few months.

Centenary of the First World War at Glasgow Cathedral

On Monday 4th August at Glasgow Cathedral, Melissa, Emma and myself, representing 65th Glasgow Girl's Brigade Company, formed part of a guard of honour outside the cathedral. We welcomed guests and then attended the service inside. The service was to commemorate all those who were affected by World War One, and the sacrifice made by those who lost their lives. It was a great honour to be invited as guests included Prince Charles, David Cameron and Sir Trevor McDonald OBE. After the moving service we were each given a poppy which represented the fields found by soldiers at the front. We left the cathedral in silence, each of us taking our poppy to reflect upon, and to place where we felt appropriate. This has helped us to understand some of the sacrifices made then, and the freedoms we now have.
