A Word from our Minister

The June meeting of the Presbytery of Glasgow at which our Mission Plan was FINALLY approved was not without some tense moments. Feeling and emotions were high and tension was palpable at times. I was conscious that whilst it is wise to cool down excitement and speak your mind, that is not always easy to do. That reminded me of something I once read, "When people submerge their true feelings in order to preserve harmony, they undermine integrity of a relationship. They buy peace on the surface, but underneath there are hurt feelings, troubling questions, and hidden hostilities just waiting to erupt. It's a costly price to pay for a cheap peace, and it ineveitably leads to inauthentic relationships... No one says anything 'unsafe'. They never discuss misunderstandings, reveal hurt feelings, air frustrations or ask difficult questions... Offences occur, but nobody talks about them. Doubts about the other's integrity creep in, but they're never dealt with. In time such relationships deteriorate." Denying our true feelings is not advisable, but calmness can achieve reconciliation more easily than raised voices or recriminations.

Cuthbert (the Bishop of Lindisfarne in the 7th century) had difficulty in teaching the Rules of Christian community life to some of the Christian community there. At meetings he was often worn down by bitter insults, but would put an end to the arguments simply by rising and walking out, calm and unruffled. Next day he would give the same admonitions, as though there had been no unpleasantness the previous day. In this way he won the love and obedience of the community.

How do you respond when someone says something uncomfortable to you? Do you overcome your natural human instinct to reject it? Do you listen and seek the truth in the other person's concerns? Or do you get angry? Do you slip into denial, retaliation or rationalisation?

General Assembly 2023

I wonder if I am the only one who remembers the days when the General Assembly was reported on every night in the then equivalent of Reporting Scotland with Jamieson Clark? This year there was one brief mention on the Friday night saying that the Church of Scotland was planning to close lots of churches. While church closure is on the cards let me tell you that I came away from Assembly feeling very positive. The Church of Scotland is very much alive and in fact in some places it is growing. I wasn't able to attend in person but participated on Zoom.

Another of my memories from days gone by is of the adjutant leading the Purse Bearer and Lord High Commissioner by going up the steps of the Quad backwards! I am happy and relieved to report that this no longer happens.

Assembly opened on Saturday 20th May and Sally Foster Fulton was installed as the Moderator for this year. The Presbytery Clerk had said that the worship at Assembly could be very moving - I didn't believe just how moving - from the opening with Townend's version of the 23rd Psalm on Saturday to the singing of Ye Gates Lift Up Your Heads on High at Communion on the Monday to say nothing of Tuesday morning when it was 10,000 Reasons with the Principal Clerk swaying away with the best of them! It reinforced to me that at the heart of this meeting was God and His Church.

One of the highlights for me was on Tuesday was when we were addressed by the Chief Rabbi and the Jewish Christian Glossary was tabled. This was a joint piece of work with the Jewish Community and the Kirk and goes some way to building bridges following the rift caused by the Inheritance of Abraham. This Glossary is the result of work between Rabbis and Ministers of the Kirk and is a fascinating document. Tuesday afternoon was a marathon session lasting nearly nine hours when an amendment to deliverance was proposed. Eventually it was decided to refer it to the Theological Forum to reflect upon and report back next year. It was good to hear that a group of Youth Reps got together to form a group called Young Adults Guild. This group of 18-30 year olds are currently meeting online supported by the Guild and in a way replaces the Young Women's Group which folded years ago. The other thing for congregations to note is that the Pulpit Supply fee has gone up from £60 to £100 which will also impact on Locums. Now I know what my late father-in-law meant when he spoke of Ministers awarding themselves a pay rise for I did just that and then felt guilty!

Two deaf ministers of the deaf attended sitting at the front with their hearing dogs who got on splendidly! But at one point somebody stood on one of their tails and it yelped to the point where the Moderator wanted to go down to comfort it! And on the subject of ministers of the deaf, Grant Barclay brought news of Richard Durno's death to the Assembly for Richard should have been a Commissioner this year.

I thoroughly enjoyed the experience of being a Commissioner and would commend it to all. Everybody not just Elders should try to listen to some of the debates on the live stream. And the best bit to come out of Assembly for me is that the Church is alive and well and very much living.

Staff Fees for Weddings/Funerals remain as follows: Organist £80, Church Officer £50, Deputy Church Officer £40 **TOTAL £170**.



Treasurer's Report

Thank you to all the regular "givers" who have continued with their offerings so generously over the summer months. All contributions are much appreciated in these very difficult times whether it is by standing order, cheque, PayPal or offering plate on a Sunday morning.

A small number of members continue to send cheques to me on a regular basis in respect of their offerings whether Gift Aid or Freewill Offering. I am more than happy to arrange uplift of any offerings for members who are unable to attend Sunday Worship or post a cheque to me. Please just get in touch with me on 772-6015 and I will be delighted to assist.

The attached statement for the year to 18/8/2023 shows a deficit for the year to date of £13,751. This is slightly less than the deficit we would anticipate at this time of year, so we remain on track to hit our budgeted surplus figure for the year. We are awaiting settlement of our Quarter 1 and Quarter 2 2023 Tax Claims from HMRC along with our Gift Aid Small Claims Tax rebate for tax year 22/23. Our Income from Outside Agencies Income continues to grow and we are most grateful for these funds which greatly assists with meeting our day-to-day expenses. We still have £20,916 outstanding on our Giving to Grow contributions for 2022 and this sum will be paid to the Church of Scotland by November.

As I've mentioned previously, I fully appreciate that these are extremely tough times for everyone at the moment with the ongoing increase in the cost of living, but please be assured that your offerings are much appreciated and allow us to continue the work of the church.
